## **PUBLIC NOTICE**

## Proposed emergency control of declared pests by pest controllers

This is to advise all land owners in the area marked in the hatched area of the map below that, having formed the belief that the class 1 pest Mexican feather grass (Nassella tenuissima) is present in the area, and that urgent action is needed to prevent the pest from causing a significant economic, environmental or social impact in the area, pest controllers have been authorised by me under section 88 of the Land Protection (Pest and Stock Route Management) Act 2002 to enter land in the area at any reasonable time and take reasonable action to eradicate the declared pest from, or monitor or control the pest, on the land.

Land owners are requested to cooperate with this pest control program by allowing ready access to land as required by authorised pest controllers. All pest controllers who have been authorised by me are employed by the Department of Primary Industries and Fisheries. They each have an identification card which will be available for inspection upon request.
